V. ADDITIONAL FEES

All further fees (i.e. electricity, etc.) must be listed hereunder with the details of the amounts to be charged. These must have received FEI Approval before being included in the published schedule. **Only fees approved by the FEI and listed in the approved schedule can be charged by the OC.**

Stabling for each horse participating in the CSI 2* Jumping Roggel 2010 is free of charge. Every competing horse will receive **one pack of shavings** from the OC. Hay and extra bedding will be available at the stable office. The costs are **10 euro for hay and 10 euro for shavings**. At the end of the event these costs can be paid at the show secretary
The horses will be bedded only on shavings.

MCP-fee: CHF 12,50 excl. 6% VAT per horse.

Electricity will be provided at the normal cost of Euro 50,-
Euro 40,- (excl VAT) waste disposal per horse will be charged. At the end of the event these costs can be paid at the show secretary

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According to the relevant Dutch tax regulations, the Organising Committee of CSI 2* Jumping Roggel – 2010 must charge 6% VAT on all fees to be paid by Athletes. Athletes will receive an invoice, showing VAT specified separately and can apply for re-imbursalment of all VAT paid at the CSI 2* Jumping Roggel – 2010 by filling out a form to request this refund of VAT by the Dutch tax authorities.

Within six months maximum after the end of the year in which the event took place. Requests for amounts smaller than € 27,00 (Euro) will not be taken into consideration. Any such request can be handed in once a year only.

All entry and MCP-fees to be paid at the accounts office on Sunday, August 22th 2010, at the latest. The account will be made, based upon the definite entries. Payments must be made in € (Euro) **in cash**. An ATM will be at the account office as well. Payments by credit card will be debited by 6% extra over the total amount due. Extra costs for payments by cheque will be € 25,00 excl. 6% VAT.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to withhold money due from the eventual prize money won, as long as outstanding bills have not been paid.

No show consequences

Athletes **not showing up**, following a definite entry of their horses will afterwards Be charged (via their respective NFS) with all stabling fees i.e. **€ 150,00** (Euro) excl. 6% VAT [their horse, definitely entered for the event, and with hotel expenses due, according their specific hotel reservation.

NO SMOKING IN THE STABLES

Since stabling is limited, in principle no boxes are available for horses that do not participate in the CSI 2* Jumping Roggel 2010.

However, if the Organising Committee approves in advance the stabling of an extra horse, an amount of € 150,00 excl. 6% VAT per horse will be charged to the Person Responsible for each horse is not competing in the CSI 2* Jumping Roggel 2010. Requests for extra boxes must be sent with the definite entries.

At the stable area there are separated waste bins for paper, glass, plastic, dung and other rubbish. Please hand the rubbish in the indicated bins. It is absolutely forbidden to hand the rubbish in the shavings or in the stable! A **penalty of €100.00** will be charged when these rules are not followed per transgression.

Shavings and hay have to be ordered before 10.00 a.m. for the same day and will be put on the expense note.

VI. FACILITIES OFFERED (Art. 132, 133)

1. Officials

Officials are the guests of the Organising Committee; hotel accommodation with breakfast, lunch and dinner will be paid by the Organising Committee (extra's, telephone, drinks, charges for the use of the internet, etc. not included);

Grooms (maximum 1 per athlete), will stay at the event at their own expense. Grooms and others, if not staying in the lorries, must arrange their proper hotel reservation. For those staying at the event, the Organising Committee will provide sufficient clean sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water, for male and female grooms.

The person responsible must ensure that his/her grooms and/or other authorised person(s) with access to his/her horses, are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures.

However, horses may not arrive earlier than Wednesday 18th / 09.00 hrs and must depart no later than Monday the 23rd August 2010 / 08.00 hrs am, unless otherwise agreed upon in advance with the Organising committee.

1. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

Following each competition a distribution of prizes will take place; athletes up to and including the 8th place will be invited to attend to each prize giving ceremony.

V. MISCELLANEOUS

2. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

Allocation of money prizes will be based on one prize for each four competitors, with a minimum of five prizes per competition. Prize money will be paid on Sunday August 22th 2010, after the last start of the competitor in Euro.

Up to an amount of € 250,00 maximum, prize money will be paid by the Organising Committee in cash to the relevant athlete; in case the amount of prize money won exceeds the maximum mentioned above, prize money will be transferred to the athlete's bank account, within 14 days after the conclusion of the event.

In accordance with the relevant specific Dutch tax regulations, no income tax will be deducted from prizes won by home athletes or by foreign athletes from a country with which the Netherlands have made a treaty in order to avoid double income tax levies. However, 20% income tax will be deducted from prize money won by foreign athletes, domiciled in a country with which The Netherlands do not have a similar tax treaty.

In all cases, athletes will be invited to provide all necessary information, in order to guarantee the correct tax procedure; to this purpose all athletes must provide the Organising Committee with a copy of the relevant pages of their passport, Sofi-number and their home address. Every athlete is responsible for the correctness of the details

3. INSURANCES

The Organising Committee does not accept responsibility for any accidents which happen to owners, participants, grooms, to or because of their horses to third parties in whichever circumstances, inside or outside the showground, during, before or after competitions.

The civil and financial responsibility of the Organising Committee and its co-operators will never be liable in any circumstance

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
